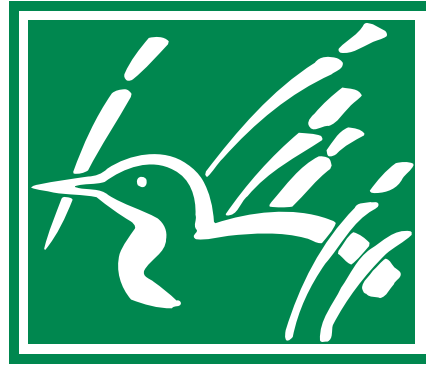

More for Mary's

Description of Project:

Mary's Place is a non-profit housing facility focused on helping the homeless, no-income, and low-income individuals in Marshfield and surrounding areas. Mary's Place exists to provide housing to those in need. Individuals can stay for up to 6 weeks rent free while looking for a job. Low income individuals are able to stay a longer period as transitional tenants.

The Mission for Mary's Place is to help those in need not only get back on their feet but to help them by providing them with the knowledge to be active members in our community by working and establishing residency.

Only after touring Mary's place through Leadership Marshfield on Thursday, October 18, 2018 for Community Engagement Day did our group decide on a project. We were so impacted by the overall declining conditions of the house, we felt what better way to give back to our community and those in need by fundraising for the home. We developed a theme and logo, "More for Mary's", in hopes that future Leadership groups will continue on with our vision. Even though one of the rooms, the Genesis

Room, is funded by the United Way, Mary's Place runs solely on donations of food, toiletries, and other items essential to operating a boarding house. Our Leadership Marshfield Project, "More for Mary's", is focusing on replacing all of the mattresses and box springs for the entire house. This consists of replacing 25 sets, one for each room, along with the four bunk beds in the Genesis Room.

Everyone in our group was responsible for contacting different businesses in and around the Marshfield area to see if they would be interested in making a monetary donation towards the group's project, or simply donating a twin-size set. Some members had great success in this, while others faced challenges by being denied.

Status of Project:

As of today (Monday, March 4, 2019), we have received all monetary and mattress donations needed to fulfill our project's obligation of 25 twin-size mattress sets. We also received a donation from Advanced Disposal for the disposal of all the old sets. At our next Leadership Marshfield meeting on Thursday, March 14, 2019, we will be discussing the delivery date and time of the mattresses to Mary's Place.

Community Reforestation Project

Description of Project:

The goal of the project is to provide a visible platform for the community to learn about the benefits and importance of an urban forest while providing a space to house forty trees that will be planted in our community annually.

We will be constructing a gravel tree bed at Wildwood Park and Zoo. There are several benefits of having a gravel bed in our community. Saving of money, trees can be purchased as bare root trees at 1/4 to 1/2 the price of typical containerized trees. Tree health and survival rates significantly increase when trees are housed and transplanted from a gravel bed. Planting times can be modified or staged throughout the growing season to encourage more volunteer opportunities.

We will incorporate educational signage near the gravel bed. Sign topics will include: The Benefits of Urban Forests, What is a Gravel Tree Bed, The Benefits of a Gravel Tree Bed, Trees and Animals that Need Them, a kids themed sign that is All About Trees, and a tree ring Counting the Age of a Tree.

Status of Project:

The Marshfield Parks, Recreation and Forestry Committee agreed to be a partner for the project. This ensures that we have a location available and gives sustainability that the project will live on for years to come.

We have secured donations from several generous individuals, organizations, and companies including; Marshfield Parks and Recreation Department, Marshfield Utilities, Staab Construction, Doine Excavating, Sternweis & Sons, Quik Print LLC, Marshfield Sunrise Rotary, Marshfield Leadership Alumni, and Ed and Deb Englehart.

Educational signs are being designed; we plan to send them to print by Friday March 8th. We anticipate having the signs back and ready for display by graduation on April 11th.

We plan to have graduation PowerPoint available for review by April 6th with final PowerPoint ready for April 11th

Gravel bed construction – 20' Wide X 40' Long. TBD (spring of 2019, weather dependent)

Trees – 40 bare root trees have been ordered, arrival TBD on bed availability

Community planting – We will be planting trees in late August with local Marshfield Boy and Girl Scout Troops

Marshfield Area Great Diaper Drive

Description of Project:

Our project is to hold a Marshfield area diaper drive. Local organizations such as Soup or Socks and the Hannah Center supply thousands of diapers to children in our community each year. These organizations often struggle to meet the needs of their families, especially in the larger size diapers.

We are partnering with the Marshfield Area United Way for the diaper drive. The United Way will serve as the intermediary between our project team and organizations and individuals in the community.

The goal at the end of the diaper drive is that we are able to meet the needs of organizations and individuals that express a need for diapers in the year. The initial plan is for an annual drive however depending on the response in both the donations and the need, the plan can be reevaluated.

In addition to diapers, our drive will include adjacent complementary items including wipes and diaper cream.

Status of Project:

The diaper drive will take place from May 2-18, 2019.

Leading up to the actual diaper drive, we have applied for some grant funds to help in purchasing diapers and related supplies.

Flyers promoting the drive have been created. The flyers will be included in local communications including the monthly MACCI newsletter and the MACCI Monday Morning Message.

Local businesses and churches will act as a drop off sites for items during the drive. These locations will be publicized prior to the drive.

We are developing a plan with the City of Marshfield communications coordinator to promote the diaper drive.

The United Way will promote the diaper drive on their website. Monetary donations can be made via their website or mailed to their office.

Rebranding of PDC Orenda Center

We have reworded and combined many different brochures into just a few general brochures.

We are now working on getting the brochures translated into Spanish and professionally printed.

Our group has been working with Pat Sternitzky, a web developer from USAGnet updating the PDC website. Our group has been the mediator between PDC and Pat; proofreading and reviewing the website through the process.

Leadership Marshfield Alumni Network

“How do I stay involved in Leadership Marshfield?”

The Leadership Marshfield Alumni Network allows graduates to stay involved in the Leadership Marshfield program. It provides ongoing support, new leadership and learning opportunities for alumni and fellowship for current and previous participants.

Current Alumni activities include the following:

- **“Adopt A Highway”** Each year, alumni members pick up trash along a two-mile stretch of Highway 80 South between Marshfield and Pittsville as part of the state’s program.
- **Continuing Leadership** Various workshops are offered to strengthen professional development skills.
- **Scholarships** are made available to individuals interested in participating in the Leadership Marshfield program, through the Leadership Marshfield Alumni. Individuals must be employed by a non-profit organization.
- **Grant dollars** are awarded to the current class should they request start-up dollars for their projects.
- **Christmas Giving Project** For the past several Christmas seasons, the Alumni have raised funds to buy children’s gifts for families served by agencies. In 2018, a total of \$920 was collected by the Alumni through personal donations and a

check was presented to the Marshfield Area United Way to purchase items for families through the NOW program.

- **Alumni Project Presentation** Alumni have given talks regarding their projects from their Leadership Marshfield class and some have assisted in planning and facilitating future Leadership Marshfield program days.
